<p>OPENING REMARKS</p>	<p>City Manager Buchanan welcomed attendees and briefly describe the plan for the retreat and what was hoped to be gained from the process. He described the reality of the budget; after all the mandated projects, programs and expenditures were accounted for; discretionary dollars were only a small piece of the budget pie. Discretionary dollars were described as money that could be used to generate new and exciting direction and endeavors for a City. He expressed that today's discussion is to help Council and the City Manager to gather ideas on how best to</p>

	<p>deploy those discretionally dollars and to begin the process of crafting the 2017-2018 budget that delivers the most value for the money.</p>
<p>DISCUSSION OF BUDGET PRIORITIES</p>	<p>Finance Director Fritts gave a brief presentation on the budget approach/philosophy that has got the city to where it is today. He presented some high-level projections for what the future holds based on perceived storms and opportunities on the horizon.</p> <p>Financial Overview and Budget Strategy</p> <p>Each Commission/Board was given time to discuss with Council & Staff items and issues they would suggest Council/Staff consider for the upcoming 2017-2018 Budget. Topics included desired service improvements, areas of concern to address, proposed projects, proposed programs, etc.</p>

Next the staff assisted Council in identifying common themes in the Council's selections and worked to group these selections into categories or areas of focus.</p> <p>Results of the Prioritization Exercise establishing four main groups for focus:</p> <p>Green Woodinville - 15 points Tree Canopy Protection Land Acquisition LID Implementation Parks Capital Projects Rail Corridor Landscaping</p> <p>Vision Institutionalizing Downtown - 10 points Old Woodinville Schoolhouse/Civic Campus Development Guidelines Relationship with Sammamish Valley</p> <p>Transportation - 10 points Improve Pedestrian Safety Transportation Planning Rail Corridors Traffic Capacity Improvement Lobbyist AGRI-Tourism Investment Project</p> <p>Public Information - 1 point Public Information and Outreach</p> <p>The City Manager summarized what has been heard/learned to go forward with the upcoming budget preparations.</p> <p>Members of the Council shared final comments.</p>
