ORDINANCE NO. 51

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING VARIOUS CHAPTERS AND TITLE 6 OF THE KING COUNTY CODE RELATING TO BUSINESS LICENSES AND REGULATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Woodinville has entered into an interlocal agreement between King County and the City relating to regulatory licensing of certain businesses, and

WHEREAS, under the interlocal agreement the City is delegating authority to administer certain business licensing functions to King County, and

WHEREAS, the following regulations are in the best interest of the public health, safety, and general welfare, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. King County Codes Adopted. The City hereby adopts by this reference the following chapters in Title 6 of the King County Code:

- 6.01 General Licensing Provisions
- 6.04 Amusement Devices
- 6.08 Amusement Places
- 6.12 Pool and Billiard Tables
- 6.16 Closing Out Sales
- 6.20 Dances
- 6.28 Gocart Tracks
- 6.36 Junk Dealers
- 6.40 Massage Parlors and Public Bath Houses
- 6.48 Music Machines

- 6.52 Outdoor Musical Entertainments
- 6.56 Pawnbrokers
- 6.60 Secondhand Dealers
- 6.68 Theaters
- 6.76 Charitable Solicitations

Section 2. Modifications. The above-referenced chapters in the King County Code are modified as follows:

1. References to King County shall be to the City of Woodinville
2. References to "Director" shall be to the City Manager or designee.
3. References in Section 6.01.150 to the King County Board of Appeals shall be to the City of Woodinville Hearing Examiner.

Section 3. Penalty. Any person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished as set forth in Woodinville Ordinance No. 16.

Section 4. Civil Penalties. In addition to or as an alternative to any other penalty provided herein, any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a civil penalty as provided in Woodinville Ordinance 20.


Section 5. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 6. Effective Date. The City Council finds that the City of Woodinville will be incorporated on March 31, 1993.

Failure to have the regulations contained in this ordinance in existence as of the date of incorporation will mean that the subject matter of this ordinance will be unregulated and thus will cause substantial detriment to the public health, safety and general welfare. The City Council therefore declares that an emergency exists necessitating that this ordinance be in full force in effect on March 31, 1993. This ordinance or a summary thereof consisting of the title shall be published in the City's official newspaper.
