RESOLUTION NO. 50

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, ESTABLISHING RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR ADOPTING ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, RCW 35A.11.020 gives the City Council of each code city the power to organize and regulate its internal affairs within the provisions of Title 35A RCW, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Woodinville believes that issues before the City Council should have every opportunity for public discussion, and

WHEREAS, by requiring two readings at subsequent regular City Council meetings, an issue would be more readily available for public comment,


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All ordinances shall have two separate readings. At each reading the title of an ordinance shall in all cases be read prior to its passage; provided that should a Councilmember request that the entire ordinance or certain of its sections be read, such requests shall be granted.

Section 2. The provision requiring two separate readings of an ordinance may be temporarily suspended at any meeting of the Council by a majority vote of all members present.

Section 3. If a motion to pass an ordinance to a second reading fails, the ordinance shall be considered lost.
