

RESOLUTION NO. 79

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE,  
WASHINGTON, AMENDING RESOLUTION 71, SETTING  
CERTAIN FEES.

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 71 amends Resolution 52, which establishes fees for fire permits, land use application fees, right-of-way and development fees; and

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance 94 establishes that fees for Outdoor Musical Entertainment Licenses, as provided under contract through King County; will be set by resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, the fees as shown in Attachments A, B, and C hereto reflect the fees for certain Licenses, NOW, THEREFORE,


**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**



**C.F.: Consultant Fees.** In addition to the application fee, the applicant shall reimburse the City for the costs of professional consultants hired by the City to process and/or review and inspect the applicant's proposal when the City is unable to do so with existing in-house staff. These professional services may include, but shall not be limited to, engineering, traffic engineering, legal, planning, Hearing Examiner, environmental review, financial and accounting, soils, mechanical and structural engineering, and electrical engineering. The City may require the applicant to deposit an amount with the City to cover anticipated costs of retaining professional consultants.

**S.F.: Single-Family Residential.** Single-family residential application fee applies to applications which meet the following criteria:

- (a) The proposed type of action will not change the existing and/or proposed single-family or duplex use of the property; and
- (b) The property is zoned RA, R-1, R-4, R-6, or R-8, and developed with a single-family or duplex residence;
- or
- (c) The property includes a single-family residential dwelling or duplexes; or
- (d) A building permit for a single-family residence has been applied for on the property.
