RESOLUTION NO. 97

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR THE WOODINVILLE VALLEY TRAIL PROJECT TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION AS PROVIDED BY THE WASHINGTON WILDLIFE RECREATION PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the City of Woodinville's Interim Comprehensive Plan, adopted December 3, 1993, recognizes the need "a community wide trail system" which "connects regional trails with local trails and walkways", and the City's Visioning Process gave many citizens the opportunity to identify trails as essential to the future of this community; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Woodinville considers it in the best public interest to provide such facilities and has directed the Planning Commission to make acquisition and development of the Woodinville Valley Trail the top trail recreation priority for 1995; and

WHEREAS, the Citizens Advisory Panel of the Parks and Recreation Subcommittee of the Woodinville Planning Commission has identified the project as their top trail priority, and has documented the widespread public support for this project; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and habitat conservation areas and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City Manager be authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance.

Section 2. That any fund assistance so received be used for the acquisition of the Woodinville Valley Trail.

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Section 3. That the City's share of the project funds will be derived from ISTEPA Enhancement funds, WSDOT funds, or local funds.

Section 4. That any property acquired or developed with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided, and agreed to by the City Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency.


Section 5. That this resolution become part of the formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

Section 6. That adequate notification has been given and the opportunity provided for public input and that published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
