

**RESOLUTION NO. 111**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING APPLICATION(S) FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR THE WILMOT COMMUNITY PARK PROJECT TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION AS PROVIDED BY THE WASHINGTON WILDLIFE RECREATION PROGRAM.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Woodinville has approved a Master Plan for the Wilmot Community Park.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Woodinville considers it in the best public interest to develop such facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Citizens Advisory Panel of the Parks and Recreation Subcommittee of the Woodinville Planning Commission has identified this project as their top priority, and has documented the widespread public support for this project; and

**WHEREAS**, under the provisions of the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and habitat conservation areas and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** That the City Manager may be authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance.

**Section 2.** That any fund assistance so received be used for the development of Wilmot Community Park.

**Section 3.** That the City's share of project funding will be derived from private donations, and other sources.

**Section 4.** The City of Woodinville does hereby certify that it is responsible to support all non-cash commitments to the local share should they not materialize.

**Section 3.** That the City's share of project funding will be derived from private donations and City funds;

**Section 4.** That any property acquired or developed with financial aid through the Future Funding Initiative be placed in use in accordance with the terms of the Initiative;

**Section 5.** That this resolution become part of the formal application to the County; and

**Section 7.** That adequate notification has been given and the opportunity provided for public input.
