

**RESOLUTION NO. 113**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING APPLICATION(S) FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR PARKS, RECREATION, AND CRITICAL RESOURCES THROUGH THE FUTURE FUNDING INITIATIVE, AND STATING THE INTENT OF THE CITY TO FUND THESE PROJECTS WITH BOND PROCEEDS.**

**WHEREAS**, a King County and the suburban cities within King County have noted deficiencies in the level of parks, recreation, and open space within their jurisdictions and have projected even greater deficiencies with further growth; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has the authority to place a bond issue before the voters which would provide for the distribution of funds for the acquisition and development of parks, recreation facilities, and the preservation of critical resources; and

**WHEREAS**, City Council of the City of Woodinville considers it in the best public interest to develop a system of parks, recreation, and open space as is called for by the Draft Comprehensive Plan;

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** That the City Manager may be authorized to submit a list of projects for purposes of allocating bond proceeds that includes Wilmot Community Park, Nelson Open Space, Kingswood Neighborhood Park, Wellington Neighborhood Park, and Winchester Pond Interpretive Facilities for the base allocation, Woodinville High School Soccer Fields, Waterford Park, and Boston Market for the Partnership allocation, and Nelson Open Space and Little Bear Creek Interpretive Facility for Critical Resource allocation.

**Section 2.** That any fund assistance so received be used for the purpose of acquiring, developing, and maintaining Woodinville parks, open space, and critical resources.

**Section 5.** That any property acquired or developed with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided, and agreed to by the City Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency.

**Section 6.** That this resolution become part of the formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

**Section 7.** That adequate notification has been given and the opportunity provided for public input and that published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.

**Section 8.** That the City of Woodinville does certify that it is the owner of the land to be developed and based on current knowledge, provides assurance there are no encumbrances on the land which would restrict the recreation or habitat conservation use of the land as proposed in this application.
