

RESOLUTION NO. 170

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE,
WASHINGTON, ESTABLISHING CERTAIN FEES,
AMENDING RESOLUTIONS 121, 117, 100, 95, 85, AND 79.

WHEREAS, previous resolutions established fees for fire permits, land use application fees, right-of-way and development fees; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Department have developed programs that have fee implications;

WHEREAS, fees established by prior resolutions, have been reviewed and are recommended to be amended to reflect the costs of providing those services, NOW, THEREFORE,


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. New Attachments A, B, C, D, and E setting fees for Planning, Permitting, Fire District Charges, Parks and Recreational fees, and Miscellaneous fees are hereby established, and shall be effective on the date of Council adoption.

Section 2. Severability/Savings. If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance or any regulation adopted or amended hereby should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance or any regulation adopted by amended hereby. Provided, however, that if any tax or fee structure established by this ordinance is declared by such court to be in conflict with, or invalid under Initiative 695, the tax or fee in effect prior to such declaration of invalidity or conflict shall be restored and any ordinance or resolution establishing such tax or fee in effect immediately before the adoption of this ordinance shall be revived and in full force and effect as to such invalid tax or fee only, as if this ordinance were never adopted.



BUILDING VALUATION DATA

At the request of numerous building officials, *Building Standards™* offers the following building valuation data representing average costs most buildings. Because residential buildings are the most common for many cities, two general classes are considered for these, one for "average" construction and the other for "good." Adjustments should be made for special architectural or structural features and the location of the project. Higher or lower unit costs may often result.

The unit costs are intended to comply with the definition of "valuation" in Section 223 of the 1997 *Uniform Building Code™*. Thus include architectural, structural, electrical, plumbing and mechanical work, except as specifically listed below. The unit costs also include the contractor's profit, which should not be omitted.

The determination of plan check fees for projects reviewed by the International Conference of Building Officials will be based on values computed from these figures, which were established in April 1999.
