

RESOLUTION NO. 177

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING APPLICATION(S) FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR THE LITTLE BEAR CREEK HABITAT CONSERVANCY TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER 79A.15 RCW, ACQUISITION OF HABITAT CONSERVATION AND OUTDOOR RECREATION LANDS.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Woodinville's Parks Recreation & Open Space Plan, recognizes the need for a lineal park along the Little Bear Creek Corridor consisting of habitat conservation areas, interpretive facilities, passive nodes adjacent to the City's Central Business District, and safe pedestrian walkways and trails as essential to the future of this community; and

**WHEREAS**, the Woodinville City Council considers it in the best public interest to provide such facilities and has directed the Parks and Recreation Department to make acquisition of key habitat areas identified in the Little Bear Creek Corridor Plan the top park and recreation priorities for 2000; and

**WHEREAS**, the Salmon Task Force and the Parks and Recreation Commission have identified acquisition and protection of remaining habitat projects as their top priority, and have documented the widespread public support for these projects through the annual Capital Improvement Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, under the provisions of the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program, State and Federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and habitat conservation areas and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** That the City Manager may be authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance.

**Section 2.** That any funding assistance so received be used for the acquisition of key habitat and development of interpretive facilities, trails, and park areas along the Little Bear Creek Corridor.


**Section 3.** That the City's share of the projects will be derived from King County Conservation future bond funds, Northshore Park and Recreation Service Area bond funds, ISTEPA Enhancement funds, grant funds, or local funds.

**Section 4.** That any property acquired or developed with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided, and agreed to by the City Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected Federal agency.


**Section 5.** That this Resolution becomes part of the formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

**Section 6.** That adequate notification has been given and the opportunity provided for public input and that published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
