**A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND ACKNOWLEDGING  
BARBARA SOLBERG AS A COUNCILMEMBER  
OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE**

WHEREAS, Barbara Solberg was elected in November of 1995 to serve on the City Council and re-elected as a Woodinville City Councilmember in November of 1999; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Solberg is a strong advocate of salmon protection and has completed training as a volunteer Salmon Watcher; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Solberg served as Chair of the City's Salmon Task Force charged with the development of a strategic response for the City to address regulations associated with the Endangered Species Act; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Solberg represented the City on the Sammamish Watershed Forum and the Watershed Resource Inventory Area (WRIA-8); and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Solberg, as a member of the Finance Committee, carefully considered the many fiscal issues that surfaced during her tenure; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Solberg was the first Woodinville City Councilmember to complete the Association of Washington Cities Certified Municipal Leadership Program; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Solberg has supported the employees of the City and has cultivated an intuition as to when City staff need to have their donuts:
