

## RESOLUTION NO. 226

### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON ESTABLISHING FUNDING FOR A PUBLIC ART PROGRAM FOR ART IN CITY-OWNED FACILITIES AND SPACES FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003 AND 2004.

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**WHEREAS**, the City recognizes the important role of art in the cultural enrichment of residents, the aesthetic quality of its physical environment, and the community character and civic identity of Woodinville; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has established a Public Art Program and a Public Art Committee to incorporate art into specified City-owned public places to enhance appreciation for art and cultural heritage, and the enjoyment of public places; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council wishes to fund the Public Art Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Annual appropriation.


- A. A budget line item known as the "Public Art Program" will be created within the Parks Department budget for the purpose of expanding access to and appreciation for art and cultural heritage and the enjoyment of public places.
- B. The Council shall appropriate an amount of \$12,000 per year for the years 2003 and 2004 for purposes of funding the Public Art Program.

Section 2. Use of Funds.

- A. The Public Art Advisory Committee shall be responsible for recommending a strategy for expanding access to and appreciation for art and cultural heritage and the enjoyment of public places using the Public Art Program annual appropriation.
- B. The Committee will be responsible for advising the Parks and Recreation Commission on use of the annual appropriation, which will then forward recommendations to the City Council for approval.
- C. During the budget deliberations for 2005, the Parks & Recreation Commission shall be responsible for recommending a long-term strategy for funding public art to the City Council.


