

RESOLUTION NO. 480

A RESOLUTION OF THE WOODINVILLE CITY COUNCIL ADOPTING A SIX-YEAR TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE YEARS 2017-2022 FOR SUBMISSION TO THE WASHINGTON STATE SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE WASHINGTON TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT BOARD.

WHEREAS, traffic congestion relief is a top priority of the City to preserve the quality, economic base, and livability of the community; and

WHEREAS, the growth of the region in housing and employment has created increasing demands and needs for a reliable transportation system; and

WHEREAS, Woodinville is committed to short and long range planning to protect, preserve, and enhance its roadways; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of RCW Chapters 35.77 and 47.26, the City Council of the City of Woodinville has previously adopted a Comprehensive Street Program, including an arterial street construction program, and has thereafter periodically modified said Comprehensive Street Program by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the work accomplished under the Program, determined current and future City street and arterial needs and, based upon these findings, has prepared a Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program for the ensuing six (6) calendar years; and

WHEREAS, the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program is based on the City's adopted Transportation Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program has been updated for 2017-2022 in accordance with the State requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program is critical for identifying funding needs for both the City and the State; and

WHEREAS, the City expects to construct all projects contained within the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program provided funding can be secured; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was duly noticed and held on June 7, 2016 to receive comment about the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program, in compliance with RCW 35.77.010;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODINVILLE, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program Adopted. The Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program for the City of Woodinville, as revised and extended for the ensuing six (6) calendar years (2017-2022), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and which Program sets forth the project location, type of improvement and the estimated 2016 cost thereof, is hereby adopted and approved.

City approval of the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program is subject to annual prioritization and City appropriation of funds. Projects receiving grant funding will receive higher priority as funds are available.

The 2017-2022 Transportation Improvement Program is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan.

Section 2. The City of Woodinville shall give priority to transportation projects which address concurrency requirements under the State Growth Management Act. City goals to meet State concurrency requirements may be jeopardized by inconsistent availability of State and regional funding.




