Question 13. Historic and Cultural Preservation:

- a. Looks fine
- b. I do take exception to the phrase "Native Americans used the Sammamish River valley..." I would argue that we still use and have been a continued presence in the Valley for thousands of years. Maybe use something similar to "Native American have *used*..." We are a living culture and should not be regulated to just having lived in the past.
- c. There is always the chance for disturbance of cultural/archaeological resources, I would strongly urge the City to consider adding language to support something such as an archaeological unanticipated discovery plan or something similar for your protection when something is discovered during a development.

I understand this is viewed as a non-project action, but please keep in mind that cultural resources are not always evident and should be considered in every aspect of a project. Again, thank you for the opportunity to comment.

Dear Honorable Council Members,

It is that time when you are moving forward with the Comprehensive Plan and budget. Like many cities, you are developing pedestrian friendly plans.

I ask that you carefully consider the details of these plans. I have tried to be very general and not specify any particular pedestrian area. I believe you could walk any trail and ask these questions concerning urban planning and public safety.

Please ask yourself these questions and consider how improvements can be made to the Comprehensive Plan and associated budget.

CITY PLANNING QUESTIONS REGARDING TRAILS

Trail Design

- What is the purpose of the trail?
- Who uses the trail?
- Is the surface of the trail conducive to designated activities?
- Do the entry and exit points connect to sidewalks and crosswalks?
- What areas does the trail intend to connect?

Safety

- How often is the area inspected for risks?
- Are fallen trees blocking the trail?
- Could diseased or dead trees fall on the trail?
- Is there evidence of erosion?

Posted Signs

- Do entrance signs provide clear directions or a map?
 - Are the hours of operation clearly posted?
 - Are trail rules posted? (such as no smoking, alcohol, or drugs)
 - Do signs indicate where and how people can get help and report maintenance problems?

- **Maintenance**
 - Is there a clear party responsible for park maintenance?
 - Are there signs of physical disorder (garbage or graffiti)?
 - Are there garbage cans to encourage community responsibility?

Lighting

- Could lights be installed at trail entrance and exit points?
- Is lighting adequate enough for a person to get a good look at someone else from a reasonable distance?

Sight Lines

- Do paths have unimpeded sight lines, especially where they curve or change grade, so that people can see into and out of an area?
- Are landscape materials chosen and maintained so that they don't block sight lines from the street or along paths?

Isolation

- Could anyone hear you if you shouted for help?
- Is the area enclosed so that passersby cannot see into it?
- Is the area above or below grade and hidden from the street?
- Does anyone patrol the area? If so, how often

Budget

- Does the budget include monthly maintenance?
- How many staff hours required to keep the trail up to safe standards?
- What equipment and supplies are needed for routine maintenance?
- What equipment is needed to remove a tree that has fallen or is in danger of falling?
- Is there a line in the budget for equipment rental or contract services for large maintenance issues or projects?
- Is there a budget line for watering/nourishing recently planted items?
- If trees planted for mitigation have died, is there a line in the budget for replacement?
- Do Police have dedicated hours for routine patrol on the trail on bicycle?

I am sure that there is much more to be considered. I hope that we are able to look at the details before a final vote on the Plan and budget is set.

I appreciate your service to the community of Woodinville and the many hours that you dedicate to insuring that growth is managed in a responsible way.


