

Underground Residential Tank Removal (Heating Oil) IFC Permit Application Requirements 2010

Fee: Fee listed is valid through **December 31, 2010**. The next fee adjustment will be effective January 1, 2011.

Permit fee.....\$36.00

Reference: 2003 Edition of the International Fire Code 105.7.5 (Permits), IFC 3404.2.13 (Abandoned Tanks), and IFC 3404.2.14 (Removal of Tanks)

An International Fire Code permit is required to remove, abandon, or otherwise dispose of a combustible liquids tank. See Section 105.7.5, #3 of the International Fire Code.

An IFC permit shall be obtained from the Fire Marshal's Office. Apply at the City of Woodinville Permit Center. The IFC permit application submittal shall include the following:

- 1. Three (3) sets of plans showing:**
 - a. Tank location**
 - b. Distances from buildings, roadways, utilities, other tanks.**
 - c. Piping**
 - d. Size of tank**

- 2. Name of company or individual removing the tank or preparing the tank for abandonment in place.**

- 3. Proof of certification by IFCI or other acceptable certification for the company doing the removal of the tank**

- 4. Method of abandoning in place. (Special Note: International Fire Code 3404.2.13.1.4 Exception: Residential heating oil tanks of 1,100 gallons (4,164 L) or less, provided the fill line is permanently capped or plugged, below grade, to prevent refilling of the tank.)**

- 5. Copy of L & I Contractor's License**

On completion of removal or abandonment a statement from the company doing the project work shall be supplied to the Fire Marshal's Office stating compliance with all codes was obtained. (Mail to: Woodinville Fire and Life Safety District, Attention: FMO P.O. Box 2200, Woodinville, WA 98072)

No inspection will be required by the Fire Marshal's Office.
